



HOW DO URBAN BIRDS USE GREEN SPACES?

Help us find out. It's easy, fun, and quick!

WHAT TO DO:

First pick a time and outdoor place, then watch birds for 10 minutes. Complete both sides of this form. Send the information to the Cornell Lab of Ornithology--even if you saw no birds.

HOW TO DO IT:

- 1. Pick a date, time, and place (balcony, yard, park, etc.) for your bird watch BEFORE you go out. Don't change your place or time just because you see an exciting bird elsewhere. That would skew your results. OPTIONAL: You can watch birds on one or two additional days in the same week.
2. Set the bounds of your bird-watching area. Go to your chosen place and imagine a limited area around you that is about 50 feet x 50 feet (about the size of half a basketball court or 20 x 20 adult paces). Don't worry if your area is smaller than half a basketball court or if your view is limited to a smaller area. Just note that in question 2 below.
3. At the time you chose, start your 10-minute bird watch, even if no birds are present when you begin. On the other side of this form, record which birds you see in your bird-watching area.

2. How BIG is your bird-watching area? (Please see instructions above.)

- Radio buttons for About HALF a basketball court and SMALLER than HALF a basketball court

3. At the time of your 10-minute watch, did your bird-watching area have any FOOD PROVIDED BY HUMANS? (examples: birdseed, suet, bread crumbs, hummingbird nectar, garbage)

- Day 1, Day 2 (OPTIONAL), Day 3 (OPTIONAL) with Yes, No, Unsure options

4. Does your bird-watching area have any WATER? (Choose one answer.)

- Radio buttons for Fountain/Birdbath, Bay/Estuary, Pond/Lake, Other, No Water

5. Does your bird-watching area have any PLANTS (grass, bushes, trees, potted plants, etc.)? Radio buttons for Yes, No

6. How much of your bird-watching area is PAVED? Radio buttons for None, Half or less, More than half

7. Choose just ONE answer that best describes your bird-watching area.

- Radio buttons for Single Tree or Potted Plant, Balcony Garden, Park, Community Garden, Median Strip or Traffic Island, More than One Potted Plant, Rooftop Garden, Yard, Tree-lined Street, Other

8. Is your bird-watching area more than 50 feet (more than 20 adult paces) from a ROAD or PARKING LOT?

- Radio buttons for Yes, No

9. If your bird-watching area is part of a LARGER GREEN SPACE, such as a park, large yard, etc.

(a) What is its name (if it has one)? [grid]

(b) How big is that overall GREEN SPACE, approximately?

- Radio buttons for Less than half of a city block, 1/2 to 1 city block, 1 to 5 city blocks, More than 5 city blocks, My bird-watching area is not part of a larger GREEN SPACE
